1. Formal Site Plan Review Case No. 22-05:

Mr. McPherson was not in attendance, however, he recused himself from FSPR Case No. 22-05-as Transit Village is a client of Gunster, which is the law firm at which he is a shareholder. Form 8B: Memorandum of Voting Conflict for County, Municipal, and Other Local Public Officers, is attached.

Mr. Chris Kimmerly, Urban Design Planner, indicated that this item was being brought forth as a workshop discussion as there are still outstanding issues to be resolved.

The members of the Committee determined that they wanted the applicant to provide an overview of the project first.

Mr. Neil Schiller, Esq., spoke on behalf of the applicant and introduced Mr. Michael Masanoff, who then introduced himself and the development team and gave a brief presentation.

Ms. Christy Fox, City Commissioner, spoke in support of the project.

Ms. Loraine Cargill, Director of Strategic Planning for the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority (SFRTA), spoke in support of the project.

Mr. Schiller continued a presentation on behalf of the applicant along with Mr. Bernardo Fort-Brescia, Principal at Arquitectonica, and Mr. Jon Paul Perez, President at Related Group.

Mr. Kimmerly gave a presentation on behalf of the Planning Division.

Ms. Denise Haire, Board Attorney, discussed with Staff and the applicant the provisions of Sec. 94-54(d)(4)(e) of the City's Zoning and Land Development Regulations, specifically relating to variances for the building footprint.

Vice Chairperson Mihelich opened the floor to public comment.

Ms. Coke-Maloney indicated that letters/emails had been submitted from the following, with copied provided to the Committee:

Mr. Cheguis made a motion to **APPROVE** the application, including the following three (3) variances requests:

- 1. A variance request from Section 94-312 regarding the maximum number of permitted driveway curb cuts or access points to a property.
- 2. A variance request from Section 94-111 regarding the maximum width permitted for curb cuts.

3. A variance request from Section 94-120 regarding Table IV-21 and the maximum permitted building footprint length.

The motion was made **subject to the following condition**:

1. The applicant should work out the PPRC comment issues with the Staff prior to site plan approval.

Mr. Gregory Gabriel seconded the motion. The motion **PASSED 4-1**, as depicted in the table below.

WHO MUST FILE FORM 8B

This form is for use by any person serving at the county, city, or other local level of government on an appointed or elected board, council, commission, authority, or committee. It applies to members of advisory and non-advisory bodies who are presented with a voting conflict of interest under Section 112.3143, Florida Statutes.

Your responsibilities under the law when faced with voting on a measure in which you have a conflict of interest will vary greatly depending on whether you hold an elective or appointive position. For this reason, please pay close attention to the instructions on this form before completing and filing the form.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 112.3143, FLORIDA STATUTES

A person holding elective or appointive county, municipal, or other local public office MUST ABSTAIN from voting on a measure which would inure to his or her special private gain or loss. Each elected or appointed local officer also MUST ABSTAIN from knowingly voting on a measure which would inure to the special gain or loss of a principal (other than a government agency) by whom he or she is retained (including the parent, subsidiary, or sibling organization of a principal by which he or she is retained); to the special private gain or loss of a relative; or to the special private gain or loss of a business associate. Commissioners of community redevelopment agencies (CRAs) under Sec. 163.356 or 163.357, F.S., and officers of independent special tax districts elected on a one-acre, one-vote basis are not prohibited from voting in that capacity.

For purposes of this law, a "relative" includes only the officer's father, mother, son, daughter, husband, wife, brother, sister, father-in-law, mother-in-law, son-in-law, and daughter-in-law. A "business associate" means any person or entity engaged in or carrying on a business enterprise with the officer as a partner, joint venturer, coowner of property, or corporate shareholder (where the shares of the corporation are not listed on any national or regional stock exchange).

ELECTED OFFICERS:

In addition to abstaining from voting in the situations described above, you must disclose the conflict:

PRIOR TO THE VOTE BEING TAKEN by publicly stating to the assembly the nature of your interest in the measure on which you are abstaining from voting; and

WITHIN 15 DAYS AFTER THE VOTE OCCURS by completing and filing this form with the person responsible for recording the minutes of the meeting, who should incorporate the form in the minutes.

APPOINTED OFFICERS:

Although you must abstain from voting in the situations described above, you are not prohibited by Section 112.3143 from otherwise participating in these matters. However, you must disclose the nature of the conflict before making any attempt to influence the decision, whether orally or in writing and whether made by you or at your direction.

IF YOU INTEND TO MAKE ANY ATTEMPT TO INFLUENCE THE DECISION PRIOR TO THE MEETING AT WHICH THE VOTE WILL BE TAKEN:

• You must complete and file this form (before making any attempt to influence the decision) with the person responsible for recording the minutes of the meeting, who will incorporate the form in the minutes. (Continued on page 2)

APPOINTED OFFICERS (continued)

- A copy of the form must be provided immediately to the other members of the agency.
- · The form must be read publicly at the next meeting after the form is filed.

IF YOU MAKE NO ATTEMPT TO INFLUENCE THE DECISION EXCEPT BY DISCUSSION AT THE MEETING:

- · You must disclose orally the nature of your conflict in the measure before participating.
- You must complete the form and file it within 15 days after the vote occurs with the person responsible for recording the minutes of the meeting, who must incorporate the form in the minutes. A copy of the form must be provided immediately to the other members of the agency, and the form must be read publicly at the next meeting after the form is filed.
