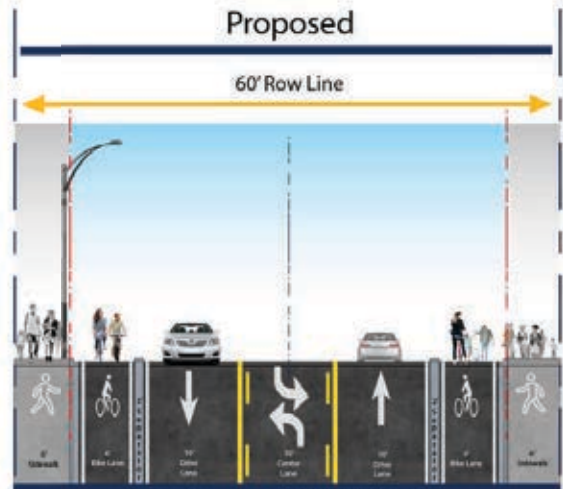


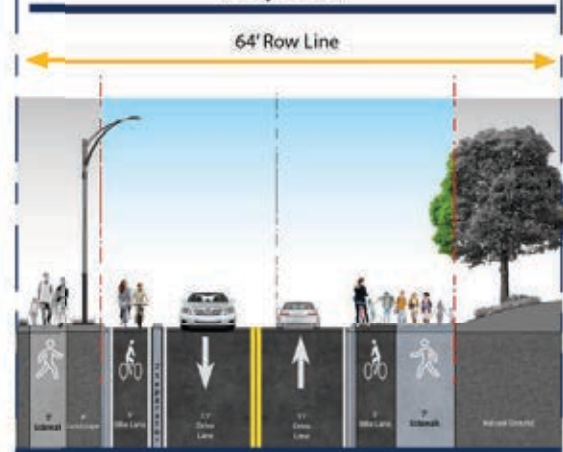
The City of West Palm Beach is conducting the 25th Street Improvements Project. The improvements include repurposing the existing four-lane roadway to a three-lane roadway, as well as new bicycle facilities, ADA upgrades, lighting improvements, milling and resurfacing of existing pavement, new six-foot sidewalk on the south side of 25th Street, upgraded pedestrian gates at the SFRTA Railroad crossings, signing/marketing upgrades, connectivity to the SunTrail, and drainage improvements. The project location is 25th Street, between Australian Avenue and U.S. Highway 1. The project cost is \$7,032,509. The facility is being developed, designed, and constructed with federal funds through the Local Agency Program ("LAP"). This Project Fact Sheet provides information about improvements.

- 01** The project features a Complete Streets approach and supports the safe use and mobility of all users, including pedestrians, bicyclists, motorists, and public transit riders, regardless of age or ability.
- 02** New bicycle lanes, with safety features, will connect residents to jobs, school, and neighborhoods.
- 03** New sidewalks will ensure ADA compliance to provide access for people of all abilities.
- 04** Between the SFRTA and Tamarind Ave., the road will be narrowed to two lanes. Construction will not exceed the existing depth to ensure no adverse impacts to the Storm of '28 Memorial Park or areas of cultural or historic significance.
- 05** Roads will be paved to eliminate potholes and improve functionality. Landscaping will be added (Except between Australian Ave. & Tamarind Ave) to provide shade, climate benefits, and beautification.

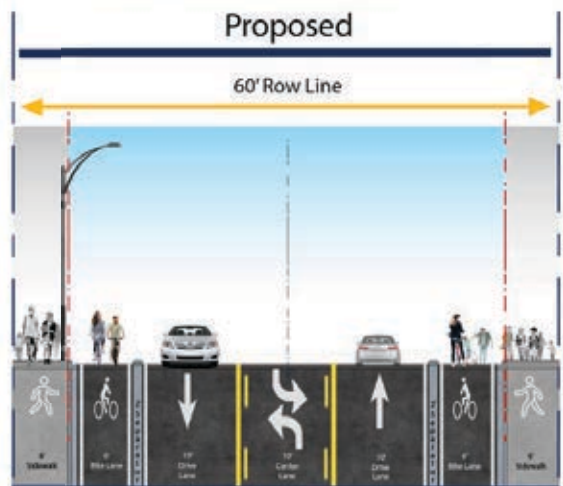
The graphic below illustrates proposed improvements, for three project sections, between Australian Ave. and US Hwy. 1/Broadway Ave.

When will this project be constructed?

The 25th Street Improvement Project is a priority project for the City of West Palm Beach. The project is currently in the design phase. We anticipate construction to begin in 2026 or 2027.

How does this project benefit the neighborhood?

The 25th Street Improvement Project will revitalize the 25th Street area, by providing safety and infrastructure improvements, connecting neighborhoods, and enhancing links to surrounding neighborhoods. Declining street conditions and aging infrastructure will be replaced or upgraded. The City of West Palm Beach is improving city streets for everyone. This project is both an infrastructure improvement and quality-of-life enhancement for our community.

What feedback is the city currently seeking?

Each city project considers the particular neighborhood and works to minimize construction impact on the community. Comments or questions may be shared at the city by using the contact information below.
